Hunsbury Meadow residents set to oppose 176 new houses

A recent planning application submitted to West Northants Development Corporation gives plans for 176 new houses off Banbury Lane as phase 4 of the Hunsbury Meadow development.

At a meeting of the residents association, fears were expressed about the extent of possible flooding on the land and that the Environment Agency could not be trusted to ensure any new buildings would be free of flooding.

In his letter of objection to WNDC, Cllr Matthews stated that the land raising of plots 100/150 Swan Valley would have an unknown affect on the flooding of this land.

Apart from flooding Cllr Matthews was also unhappy about the provision of play areas for the local children stating: "The play area provision for the whole of the Banbury Lane development must be reviewed and adequate provision for children up to 13 year olds provided with this new development."

Cllr. Matthews spoke against this application at NBC planning committee and they agree to object to the plans. It now goes before WNDC planning committee where he also intends to speak against the planning application. .

Regeneration still on despite listing application by Tories.

Following the attempt to list the entire hospital site, which still potentially could put at risk the regeneration of the hospital, it was great to see the new owners WN Developments making a start clearing the rubbish from the site.

We are sure that residents and your local Focus team are glad to see the start of hopefully, the final chapter in the regeneration of the old St Crispin's Hospital.

This could still be put at risk, if the entire site is listed as it could make the regeneration of the site uneconomic. We, like so many local residents, want to see the Clock Tower listed as it is an iconic landmark. To list the entire site was never a realistic proposition and now after years of mistreatment, vandalism and the elements, much of the site is beyond repair.

We hope that soon we will see the area tidied up and this landmark clock tower calling the time again and in a state that befits its grandeur and status as a beloved landmark on the skyline of Northamptonshire.





Planning to spend £2 million on new county quango

Conservative County Council bosses want to sack lollipop people, close libraries and cut care for the elderly and infirm, but then they are planning to spend £2 million on setting up a new Quango.

The 'Northamptonshire Economic Partnership' will duplicate the work of the West Northants Development Corporation (WNDC) which is about to be disbanded and its work handed over to local councils like Northampton Borough.

Leader of the Lib Dem opposition on the County Council, Brendan Glynane said: "It is scandalous that the Conservatives want to spend £2 million on this, when frontline services to the most needy people are being cut. The last thing we need in these difficult times is another expensive quango."

New rights for patients to obtain healthcare in the EU.

MEPs have passed new European rules allowing people to receive medical treatment in other EU Member States. They mean that if a patient unable to gain access to essential medical care within a reasonable time, would be allowed to have their treatment in another Member State, fully paid for or with the ability to claim back the cost.

This will help in cases where a particular treatment can be provided faster or more expertly on the continent.

By this new EU law, NHS doctors will still have to give prior concent for treatments abroad that can be reimbursed. Westminster must issue clear rules and guidelines for doctors, and decisions must be taken on a case-by-case basis.

The new law is not designed to encourage health tourism. Patients are only entitled to reimbursement for treatment that their home health authority would normally provide. Travel or hotel costs can not be claimed back. Furthermore, patients from other Member States travelling to the UK specifically for healthcare will have to pay the full NHS cost of treatment.
